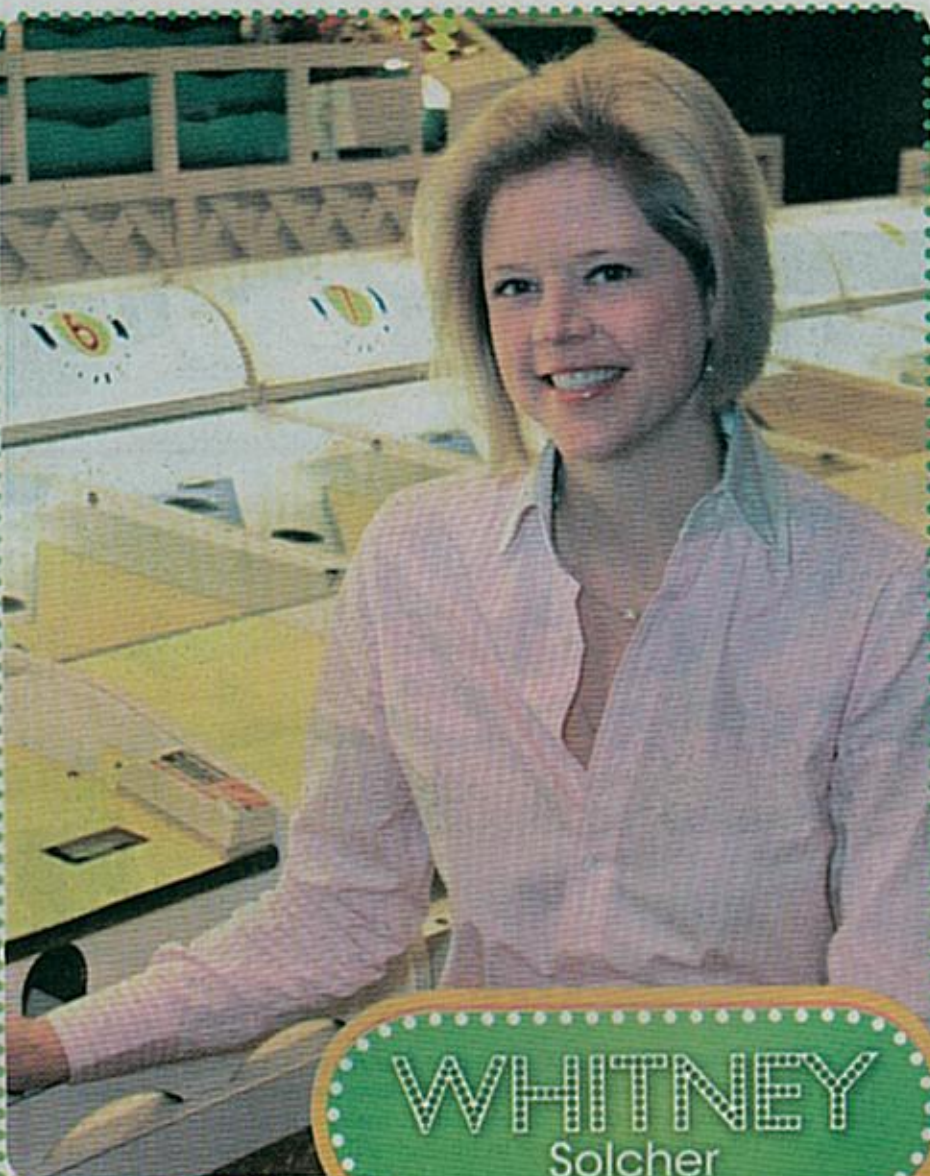

Last April Whitney Solcher married her fiance, Joe Miller. She also was approached by some high-profile San Antonians interested in backing her in an investment business. So last January she opened San Antonio Capital Management LLC, an SEC-registered investment advising firm. Within less than a year the firm now has \$70 million in assets under management.

Solcher got interested in investments at a young age. Her father, Gerry Solcher, was president of San Antonio Savings Association and taught her a lot about the finance world. When she was 12 years old, he let her open her own stock account. Right out of high school she pursued finance in college, interned for Goldman and was hired after graduation. But until last year, Whitney Solcher had one foot in Houston and one in San Antonio. Sitting on the board of the Witte Museum, St. Mary's Hall, Founder's Council for the Southwest Foundation for Biomedical Research, she juggled trips from San Antonio to Houston.

Back in San Antonio she continues to be active not only in those organizations but also the UTSA Center for Innovation and Technology Entrepreneurship. She chairs the finance committee at the Greater San Antonio Greater Chamber of Commerce and now sits on the board of the San Antonio River Foundation.
